Lady palm Common name: Lady palm, Broadleaf lady palm Botanical name: *Rhapis excelsa* Family: Arecaceae Name in Tamil: ?



Field identification: Multi-stemmed clumps with glossy, palmate leaves divided into broad, ribbed segments. Grows up to 4 m in height and 30 mm in diameter. Leaf-ends are saw-toothed unlike most other palms, occurring on slender petioles (stalk) ranging from 20 to 60 cm in length. New foliage emerges from a fibrous sheath, which remains attached to the base. As the plants age, the sheaths fall, revealing the bamboo-like trunks.
